## Use these tips to develop a solid work ethic:

- 1. Discover a quiet place to study. Find a place that's free of distractions and noise where you won't be interrupted. Ask your parents, guardians, or teachers for recommendations.
- 2. Plan a daily homework schedule, and stick to it.
- 3. Sit near the front of the classroom. Studies show students who sit there get better grades.
- 4. Identify a support system of friends and family —"study buddies" to help you get ready for tests, complete homework, and even proofread your essays and reports.
- 5. Use your library. Believe it or not, you won't find all the answers online (and you can't even be sure they're factually correct). Get a library card, make your librarian your new best friend, and you'll be surprised how much the content of your work improves.
- 6. Read the news regularly to get a better understanding of the world. Reading news articles can also help improve your comprehension skills.
- 7. Build your vocabulary. When you don't know what a word means, look it up! Register for "word of the day" notifications or download an app that introduces you to new words on a regular basis. Another way to expand your vocabulary is by using a thesaurus when you write.
